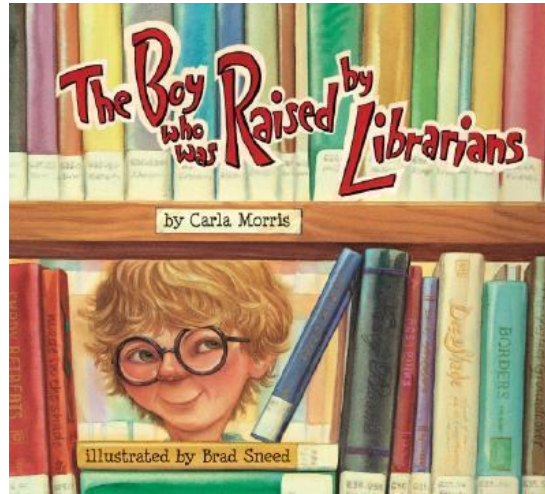


The Boy Who Was Raised by Librarians

PASS Objectives:

Standard 5 Data Analysis - The student will demonstrate an understanding of data collection, display and interpretation.

1. Collect, sort, organize, and display data in charts, bar graphs, and tables.
2. Summarize and interpret data in charts, bar graphs, and tables.
3. Make predictions and estimates to describe data.

Supplies: Large chart paper, crayons/markers

Summary: In this story, librarians help Melvin organize his bug collection and his baseball card collection. Do you have a special collection? i.e. sticker, coin, pictures, etc.

Activity: Graph It!

1. Bring your special collection to class or find a collection of something in your classroom.
2. Sort/organize your collection according to established criteria.
3. Make a chart, graph, or table to show your findings. Use the large chart paper and crayons or markers to construct your project.
4. Share your findings with the class.
