Renovated Tulsa City-County Library wins LEED Gold certification

The U.S. Green Building Council OK'd a LEED Gold certification for Central Library, the result of a three-year, \$55 million renovation.

Central Library is only the 35th building in all of Oklahoma to receive LEED Gold status and is the first downtown Tulsa location to receive the designation.

LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) is an internationally recognized certification process for green buildings, developed by the U.S. Green Building Council. The LEED process is designed to inspire project teams to seek innovative solutions that are better for the environment and communities.

Based on the number of points achieved, projects receive one of four LEED rating levels: Certified, Silver, Gold or Platinum. LEED-certified buildings are resource efficient, use less water and energy and reduce greenhouse gas emissions.
