Eight public computers; ongoing book sale; one meeting room with capacity of 75; monthly book club for adults; free Wi-Fi, laptops for in-library use, wireless printing.

**Broken Arrow Library**

Thirteen public computers and two large meeting rooms accommodate more than 100 people. Ongoing programs include: My First Storytimes; Preschool Storytimes; Stay and Play; Evening Family Storytimes; Adventures in STEAM; Paws For Reading; Read or Die Anime Club; Teen Advisory Board

The Herman and Kate Kaiser Library is located in LaFortune Park. The 10,000-square-foot library has a meeting room with a seating capacity of 75, shelving for 50,000 books, 16 public computers, lounge seating for 18, tables and chairs for 64, a children's area with a window seat, dragonfly inlays in the flooring, a teen area with retro-style booths, a fireplace setting for cozy reading and windows on all sides with views of the park.
