Central Library

The A.R. and Mary Louise Tandy Foundation Children's Garden at the Central Library hosts a variety of programs — from story time to drone flying — but draws a crowd for movie night. With enough space for over 400 people, you'll want to arrive on time to pick the perfect spot.

On Sept. 20, catch "La Bamba" in celebration of Hispanic Heritage Month. The movie tells the story of **Ritchie Valens**, rock-n-roll pioneer and forefather of Chicano rock. Doors open at 6:30 p.m., and the movie begins at 7. Admission is free. Grab treats from the on-site Starbucks while you enjoy a movie under the stars.

Philbrook Museum of Art

Tulsans have enjoyed Philbrook's summertime "Films on the Lawn" for 40 years. This year, patrons can enjoy them all year long. On the fourth Friday of every month, Philbrook opens its back lawn for a night of film, music, food trucks, activities and maybe even a surprise of two (the May film featured a real "Princess Bride" wedding).

Mark your calendars for "Moonrise Kingdom" on Sept. 22. Cost is \$6 for Philbrook members, \$8 for non-members. Children 17 and under are free. Films start at dark (times adjust by season). Doors open at 7 p.m. with garden access at 7:30. Since the museum is closed, buy tickets at the front desk and walk to the back of the building to access the lawn. **TP**
