# Agencies offer free school supplies, haircuts before students

# return to class this month

After what started with a simple act of kindness, a Tulsa nonprofit is embarking on its 27th year of giving families school supplies.

In 1990, a woman brought a \$300 check to Restore Hope Ministries to help provide school supplies to Tulsa children. This year, the nonprofit has raised \$30,000 for its back-to-school program.

Restore Hope gave school supplies to 2,809 kids from pre-K to 12th grade last year.

"If you come the last day, you will receive the same great box the first-day person received," Executive Director Jeff Jaynes said. "It always works out."

The pre-packaged boxes Restore Hope gives out includes all the supplies Tulsa teachers ask students to have before the school year. Every child receives a box with \$50 worth of supplies and a backpack.

To receive supplies at Restore Hope, a parent or guardian must bring their driver's license, their Social Security card, their child's Social Security card and proof of their child's birthdate. Jaynes said giving a child something as simple as a backpack can help tear down the wall of poverty bit by bit.

"I know education is the No. 1 factor to getting out of poverty," Jaynes said. "To see the smile on kids' faces — it makes counting 11,000 pencils worth it."

Many other organizations will provide free school supplies, haircuts, immunizations and various health-care services before schools open this month.
