## Michigan State's Izzo spent seven weeks at TU

Before he was the revered head coach at Michigan State, Tom Izzo once spent seven weeks as a recruiting coordinator at Tulsa under coach J.D. Barnett.

Thursday, Izzo looked back at his short 1986 stint in Tulsa. He left the program on short notice when a full-time position opened back home at Michigan State, where Izzo had been a graduate assistant. After reaching seven Final Fours, it's safe to say Izzo never looked back.

"I enjoyed Tulsa," Izzo said. "I will tell you this, that J.D. Barnett was a drill sergeant. He was a hard worker. So I didn't see a

lot of Tulsa. I'd go in early with my little shirt and tie on in the middle of May, 100 degrees down here, and I left the office late, and I didn't see a lot of the city. But I loved my experience here."


### Media flock to Tulsa

For coverage of the Friday and Sunday NCAA Tournament games played at the BOK Center, credentials were issued to 330 media members.

That's a substantial increase over the total for coverage of 2011 NCAA games in Tulsa. That year, there were 276 credentialed media members.

Credentials for CBS and Turner personnel are not included in the 330 total. Eighty credentials were necessary for the production of television coverage of the Friday and Sunday games.

The breakdown on coverage of the eight teams in the Tulsa field: There were 70 credentials issued for media members who are here specifically to cover Kansas,





# AT&T upgrading at BOK Center

In advance of the NCAA Tournament, AT&T upgraded its Distributed Antenna System to support the company's 4G LTE network. According to a news release, the upgrade will increase capacity by more than 51 percent throughout the BOK Center and surrounding areas.

Last year, AT&T's network had more than six terabytes of data used at the eight venues that hosted first- and second-round NCAA Tournament games, equal to more than 17.2 million selfies or surfing the web for more than 415,000 hours.
