"Fines and Feathers: A Novel of John Wilkes Booth," by Jennifer Chiaverini
John Wilkes Booth whose misguided quest

to avenge the vanquished Confederacy led him to commit one of the most notorious acts in the annals of America - has been the subject of scholarship, speculation and even obsession. He is often portrayed as a shadowy figure, devoid of human connection.

Yet, four women were integral in the life of this unquiet American: Mary Ann, the mother he revered above all but country; his sister and confidante, Asia; Lucy Lambert Hale, the senator's daughter who loved him; and the Confederate widow Mary Surratt, to whom he entrusted the secrets of his vengeful wrath. Author Jennifer Chiaverini renders for the first time as fiction the compelling interplay between these pivotal actors who made an indelible mark on the history of our nation.

Smaligo talks critical road projects at Collinsville Chamber meeting

District 1 road/bridge renewal projects

North

- Bridge on 127th E. Ave. over Horseshoe Creek (\$4.3M, VR)
- Five-mile resurfacing of 166th St. (\$272,000)
- Collinsville High School parking lot
- New railroad crossing at 126th St. and Garnett

South

- Intersection of 116th N. and 129th E. Ave. (\$2.4M)
- Bridge replacement at 166th St. N. east of Hwy 11 (\$750,000)
- Intersection of 86th St. N. and Sheridan Rd. (\$1.6M)
- 160th St. N. S. Hwy 75 to Memorial Dr. (\$794K, VR)

Other

- Intersections at 193rd E. Ave. for 35th to 46th St. S. (\$3.5M, VR)
- E. 51st St. for 161st to 177th E. Ave. (\$5.3M)
- 51st St. S. for 177th to 194th E. Ave. (\$8M, VR)

Commissioner John Smaligo of District 1 spoke as the keynote at Collinsville Chamber's monthly luncheon on Thursday, Feb. 2.

Smaligo - representing Collinsville, Owasso, Skiatook, Sperry, Turkey, and parts of Tulsa and Broken Arrow - talked with attendees about critical road and bridge projects occurring across the region.

"I try to attend as many as the Collinsville Chamber of Commerce's lunches as I can... to make myself available for any concerns, ideas that the public has on an ongoing basis," Smaligo said.

The commissioner, who oversees around 300 miles of roadway outside city limits, discussed details about 11 renewal projects totaling more than \$31.8 million scheduled for completion over the next several years.

Some northern areas include the bridge on 127th E. Ave. over Horseshoe Creek, Collinsville High School parking lot, and a new railroad crossing at 126th St. and Garnett.
