Wireless hotspots can now be checked out at Tulsa libraries

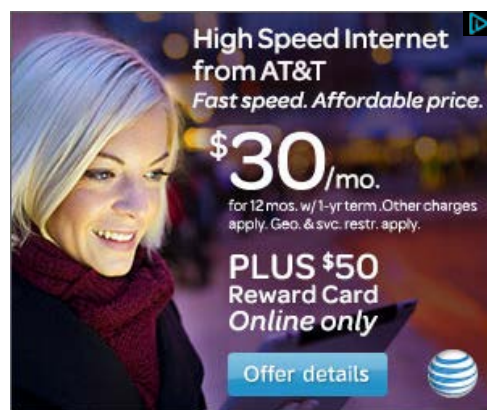

The Tulsa City-County Library has launched a service in which wireless hotspots may be checked out, expanding the availability of online connectivity.

A wireless hotspot allows a user to connect mobile-enabled devices such as laptops, smartphones and tablets to the Internet.



The service, launching with 50 devices, will be available at Martin Regional (16), Rudisill Regional (10) and Suburban Acres (12) libraries as well as the Bookmobile (12). Library customers who are 16 or older may check out a wireless hotspot for 30 days, with no holds or renewals.

"The project is being deployed as a pilot to determine whether Tulsa City-County Library can successfully bring wireless Internet to portions of our community that would otherwise have no access," said Monique

Sendze, chief technology and innovation officer of the library system.

Fines for overdue wireless hotspot devices are \$1 per day, excluding Bookmobile customers, with a maximum fine of \$10. A \$50 replacement fee is charged for lost or damaged devices.

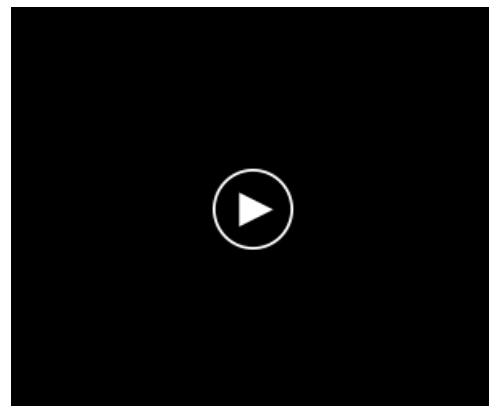
