## Screwdrivers, time travel a hit at Dr. Who preview

Dr. Who fans love the series, because they can go to another time and identity; so prying both a first and last name, or a real name, out of them is a challenge.

"I like that it's (Dr. Who) funny, and there's lots of adventure," said Emma who was playing a Dr. Who card game with her friend Maya Rogers. Both girls were attending a Dr. Who preview day at Hardesty Library Saturday, Aug. 16, an event which offered previews of the upcoming series, and conversation with other people who "get it."

Rogers said she likes television's Dr. Who series because "it's a more intelligent show in a way. It gets your brain work-

ing. You get enveloped in the plot line. It takes you to a different place." Rogers, 14, doesn't have cable, so she watches Dr. Who on Netflix which appears to be a popular way for fans to get caught up if they get into the series late.

Tim Hutchinson, who was involved in a game of Dr. Who Monopoly, said his mother works at the library and is a big Dr. Who fan. Once he got Dr. Who fever, he watched all the back series. Joshua said once he became interested, he did the same thing. Jacob, the third Monopoly player, said, "I think it's cool," "I like the whole time travel thing. It's an interesting show to follow. You have to see the entire series to understand it all."

Cosplay, which for those of us who are not fans, is dressing the part. Tuck was dressed appropriately at the preview as the 10th doctor. "I've watched it for a long time. I have been a big fan of several of the Dr. Who's."

Tuck and Andrew were

in the company of a young woman who goes by "Happiness is a Warm Hook," her Facebook handle. She crochets Dr. Who items which can be purchased at her website.

Then there was Alex, sitting with a group, putting together a character, his

contact lens eyes gleaming. Alex said sometimes when one of the characters is possessed, their eyes gleam similarly. "This is a kind of place I can have fun," Alex shared, surrounded by other fans.

Melissa Smith, associ-

ate librarian for the teens, said many of her co-workers are huge Dr. Who fans. "The preview is geared toward teens. Teens are the target audience, but all ages are welcome." Not only were all ages attending, there were many parents who attended with their children, making Dr. Who a family affair.

How does one spot a Dr. Who Fan? It's difficult to miss the red fez worn by many of the fans, part of the customary dress for the 11th Dr. Who.

Another frequent sighting is the Dr. Who multipurpose screwdriver which can be used for any number of unusual things, like taking medical scans or changing molecules, and the not so unusual such as picking locks, having more to do with science fiction than fastening things to the wall.
