Under a pilot project, FedEx drop boxes are now installed at 13 Tulsa City-County libraries in the city of Tulsa. If the project is successful, the service will extend to all 25 Tulsa City-County Library locations.

FedEx daily pickup time for all locations is 6 p.m., Monday-Friday. Pickup times may change on established holidays. Tulsa City-County libraries are offering FedEx drop boxes at Brookside, Hardesty Regional, Helmerich, Herman and Kate Kaiser and Kendall-Whittier libraries and at the Librarium.

Other libraries include Martin Regional, Maxwell Park, Nathan Hale, Rudisill Regional, Schusterman-Benson, Suburban Acres and Zarrow Regional.



WorldCom whistleblower to speak Tuesday

WorldCom whistleblower Cynthia Cooper will recount her experience uncovering one of the nation's largest corporate scandals when she speaks at a Tuesday luncheon to be held 11:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the DoubleTree by Hilton Tulsa Downtown, 616 W. Seventh St.

The luncheon is presented by Oklahoma Business Ethics Consortium (OK Ethics) in conjunction with IABC/Tulsa, The Association for Women in Communications Tulsa Chapter and PRSA Tulsa.

In 2002, Cooper led a small team of auditors, frequently in secret and at night, to uncover almost \$4 billion of unethical and illegal accounting practices at WorldCom designed to inflate assets and stock price. The internal audit team alerted the company's audit committee and board of directors, who took swift action. Soon after, the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission began an investigation that uncovered about \$11 billion in inflated assets.

Cooper is an internationally recognized speaker, best-selling author and consultant. She was named one of Time Magazine's Persons of the Year.

TPS gets CNG compressor from Bellmon Awards




