OPD, OFD respond to rollover accident on U.S. 20

At 1:30 p.m. Friday, June 6, the Owasso Police and Fire department responded to a head-on, roll-over accident near the intersection of 145th East Avenue and U.S. 20 northeast of Owasso.

Emergency crews extricated victims trapped in a rolled over vehicle, and tended to others injured in the crash, including three juvenile children.

Police initially closed down U.S. 20 to eastbound traffic while emercency vehicles transported at least six victims to Owasso and Tulsa hospitals, and wreckers moved the vehicles off the highway.

The vehicles involved were a 2011 Chevy Colorado and a 2004 Chevy Blazer.
