CHS Academic team is third at national competition

The Collinsville High School academic team had a great year. The team has nine members - six freshman, one sophomore and two juniors — officially making them a Junior Varsity team, but they competed as a varsity team all year, prior to nationals.

The team recently returned from the Junior Varsity Nationals in New Orleans where they finished third in the nation.

During the regular season (August-November) they competed in the Green Country Academic Conference with a record of 17 wins and two losses.

In the OSSAA playoffs they finished fourth in their area. At the Oklahoma Science Bowl they finished fourth in the state.

In addition to the team competitions,

these students competed individually in the Oklahoma Tournament of Champions. In the first round, the nine students took 28 subject tests and seven of nine qualified for the second round. The second round championship tournament was in Oklahoma City with 500 students from 57 school districts competing.

Rachel Hadley was 15th in the state in Geometry; Erik Tollefson was 15th in the state in U.S. Government; Sydney Vogel was 12th in the state in Geometry: Lyndee Branen was 10th in the state in Geometry; Cannon Vogel was seventh in the state in U.S. Government; Daniel Wilson was fifth in the state in English 1; Cannon Vogel was fourth in the state in English III; Cannon Vogel was third in the state in U.S. History and Cannon Vogel was state champion in both Algebra II and Trigonometry.

The team is coached by CHS Librarian Lynn Gowler.
