For working parents, it's the start of a months-long game of chess played with summer camps, vacation getaways and baby sitters.

Parents fortunate enough to have summers off with their kids still play a game to avoid the "I'm bored" syndrome.

The Tulsa area has a lot to offer in beating back the summertime tedium, from 79-cent QuikTrip drinks to the Blue Hole Park swimming and camping ground near Pryor.

Here are some suggestions.

Library reading program: Starting this week, kids can go to any Tulsa City-County library branch to start recording the books read and visits made. The coupon-book reward is worth it with free food and entertainment.

An adult reading program has been added. It's too bad the same coupon book isn't part of the prizes. Grownups like free doughnuts and cookies, too.

Second Saturdays at Philbrook: The museum is free on the second Saturday of each month and has art activities available for families and children.

Movies: Go the Admiral Twin Drive-In, especially before the evenings become scorching and mosquito infested. It's rare for today's kids to make memories at a drive-in, so take advantage of it.

The Guthrie Green is offering free Thursday evening movies through Oct. 31, including "The Wizard of Oz" and "The Outsiders." Lying on a blanket in this park is a cool new tradition.

Bowling: I've never broken a score of 120, but who cares. It's hard not to like throwing a huge ball down a lane.

Andy B's offers a Kids Bowl Free discount, and other lanes offer discount days.

The great outdoors: Traverse the River Parks trails, go to the Red Bud Valley Nature Preserve, walk around the Oxley Nature Center, view a buffalo at the Tallgrass Prairie Preserve, hike Turkey Mountain and climb the rocks at Robbers Cave near Wilburton.

Canoe, fish, ski and swim the state's rivers and lakes. My list in this category easily topped 50 different destinations.

Local parks: Our taxes are paying for city and county parks, so use them. See what classes for kids are being offered, and hang out at a splash pad, where parents are not required to wear a swimsuit and can hang out in their regular clothes — definitely a bonus.

Festivals: Every city celebrates something, whether it's peaches in Porter or pelicans in Grove. Go to one and enjoy small-town life for a day.

Building memories: There is nothing wrong with doing nothing. Improvising each summer day has its own rewards.

Some of the best summer memories are made by accident — impromptu water fights, making cookies in the afternoon, building tents of blankets on rainy days or just playing in the backyard.

A big vacation is not going to be part of our summer. It doesn't need to be with all the other possibilities.

We do the reading program at the library. They asked 2 weeks ago when it would be starting.


We use several of the city parks.
