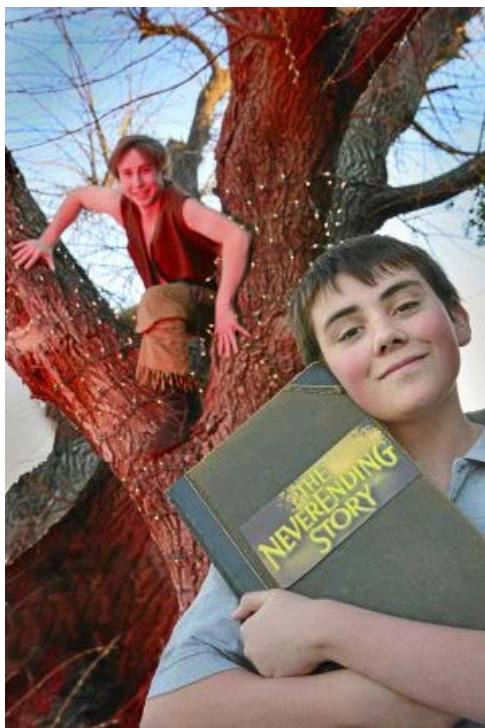

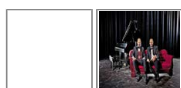

Michael Ende's best-selling fantasy, which was filmed in 1984 and spawned two sequels, has been adapted for the stage by David S. Craig. The show had its New York premiere in 2012, and now Tulsa's American Theatre Company brings the play to the Tulsa PAC.

Jana Ellis, who oversaw the company's productions of "A Midsummer Night's Dream" and "[title of show]," directs a cast of 19, led by Chris Delano as Bastian and Wesley Dotson as Atreyu.

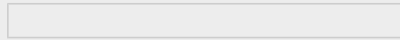
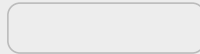
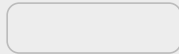
