Tulsa-area residents can take literal and symbolic steps toward a cure for multiple sclerosis during this annual, signature event for the National MS Society. Participants can walk or run a scenic three-mile route along the Arkansas River near Veterans Park, and each will receive an official Walk MS T-shirt. Other highlights include fundraising prizes, plus complimentary food and entertainment before and after the event.

Proceeds support MS research and provide services to individuals impacted by multiple sclerosis. FYI, more than 11,200 Oklahomans are affected by MS, including more than 3,700 diagnosed with the disease.

## Half a Hundred for Hospitality

Five years ago Tulsa firefighter John Buck was diagnosed with a rare form of head and neck cancer, for which he sought out-of-state treatment. Without the support and sacrifice of family, friends and the Tulsa Fire Department, his 50 days of active treatment would have been infinitely more difficult.

To celebrate his fourth year being cancer-free, Buck, who's a personal trainer at Forge Gym in the Pearl District, has kicked off the Half a Hundred for Hospitality campaign. The community is encouraged to join the cause by committing to do a variety of fitness reps for 50 consecutive days (having begun March 20) and ending the 50th day at a celebration event month after next. The celebration will feature a recognition of teams, participants and sponsors, with each participant and team that reaches their fundraising goals awarded a T-shirt. Participants and team awards will be also be given to those who raised the most support, accomplished the greatest number of fitness reps and those who had the biggest health transformation. Other highlights include the Hope Rising balloon release.

Participants can form teams and encourage their network of friends, family and coworkers to support them in their fitness challenge through online donations.

Proceeds will benefit Hospitality House of Tulsa, and go directly to helping individuals and their families as they seek medical treatment in Tulsa.

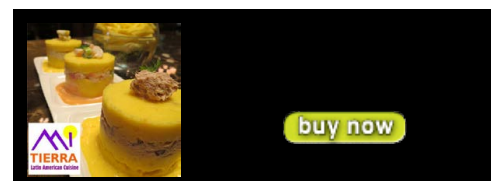
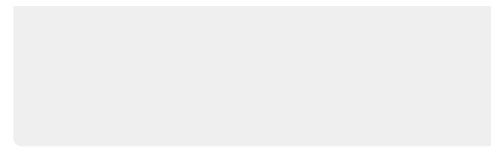

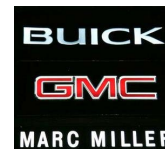

# Hobby Lobby case divides court

Supreme Court justices disagreed with majority in oral arguments from each side.

Supreme Court justices were divided in oral arguments Tuesday on whether Hobby Lobby, a religious employer, can sue the federal government for its contraceptive mandate. The justices were split 5-4, with the majority siding with Hobby Lobby and the minority siding with the government.

The case, *Burwell v. Hobby Lobby Stores, Inc.*, involves a federal law that requires employers to provide health insurance that covers certain forms of contraception. Hobby Lobby, a privately held company, claims that the law violates its religious beliefs.

The Supreme Court heard oral arguments on Tuesday. The justices were divided in their views on the case. Chief Justice John Roberts, who is expected to lead the majority, argued that the law is unconstitutional because it forces Hobby Lobby to provide health insurance that covers forms of contraception that are against its religious beliefs.

Justice Antonin Scalia, who is expected to lead the minority, argued that the law is constitutional because it is a valid exercise of Congress's power to regulate interstate commerce. He argued that the law is necessary to protect public health and that it does not violate Hobby Lobby's religious beliefs.

The case is expected to be decided by the Supreme Court in the next few weeks. The decision will have a significant impact on the rights of religious employers and on the federal government's ability to regulate interstate commerce.
