5. — Listen to and return music CDs rather than purchase them. You may also download 5 free music mp3 files per week with our Freegal music app. These are yours to keep.

4. — Browse a large selection of DVDs. You might have to wait a bit for the most current releases, but many movies are available each day, with an ever-changing collection. Check-out up to 10 movies at a time for 2 weeks.

In addition, the Freegal app for movies allows you to download 3 movies per week at no

charge.

3. — Free computers and wi-fi are available at every TCCL location.

Assistance with learning how to use new technology can be found in most of the Tulsa County Library System locations.

2. — Free programs for your children and grandchildren are available in every location. Libraries are a great way to meet other people with common interests.
