Glenpool and Jenks residents participate in Operation Christmas Child

With holiday supplies already covering the store shelves, Glenpool and Jenks individuals, families, churches and groups are working to make Christmas a reality for needy kids around the world by filling shoeboxes with toys, school supplies, hygiene items and notes of encouragement.

Operation Christmas Child, the world's largest Christmas project of its kind, is ramping up as Glenpool and Jenks

residents prepare to collect a combined total of 1,518 gift-filled shoeboxes during National Collection Week, Nov. 18 through Nov. 25.

At local collection sites in the Glenpool and Jenks areas, anyone can drop off a gift-filled shoebox to send to a child overseas. Then using whatever means necessary — trucks, trains, boats, bikes and even elephants — the shoebox gifts will be delivered to children worldwide. For many children, the shoebox gift will be the first

gift they have ever received.

The Glenpool collection site is at the Glenpool First Baptist Church, 14567 S. Broadway St. The operating hours are Nov. 18 through Nov. 22 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. and 6 to 8 p.m., Nov. 23 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., Nov. 24 from noon to 6 p.m. and Nov. 25 from 9 a.m. to noon.

The Jenks collection site is at the Crossroads Freewill Baptist Church, 2525 W. Main St. The operating hours are Nov. 18 through Nov. 22 from

9 a.m. to 2 p.m., Nov. 23 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., Nov. 24 from 9 to 11 a.m. and Nov. 25 from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Though the shoebox gifts will often travel thousands of miles, Operation Christmas Child offers a way for participants to follow their box by using the donation form found at SamaritansPurse.org. Donors will receive an email telling the country where their shoe-

boxes are delivered.

Operation Christmas Child has collected and delivered more than 100 million shoebox gifts to suffering children in more than 100 countries since 1993. Celebrating its 20th anniversary, Operation Christmas Child hopes to collect another 9.8 million gift-filled shoeboxes in 2013. Operation Christmas Child is a project of Samaritan's Purse, an international Christian relief and evangelism organization headed by Franklin Graham.

The holiday season is a time for people to reflect on what makes them grateful. Family, friends and good health come to mind for many.

Countless patients like Ethan Hoffart, however, strive for good health during the holidays, often times in a hospital room away from family and friends. Blood donations can bring them hope.

When Ethan was 10 years old, he spent most of the holiday season being treated for aplastic anemia, a disease in which the body's bone marrow doesn't make enough new blood cells. For four months Ethan was dependent on blood transfusions every seven days and platelet transfusions every three days.

"I probably wouldn't even be here if no one

Thanks in part to volunteer donors, Ethan's disease is under control, and he will be at home with his family for the holidays this year.

The American Red Cross will hold a blood drive Wednesday, Nov. 27, from noon to 6 p.m. at Jenks City Hall, 211 N. Elm St., to help ensure blood banks and medical facilities are prepared for the Thanksgiving holiday. Complimentary T-shirts will be given to presenting donors, while supplies last.

All blood types are needed, especially O negative, A negative and B negative. Appointments to donate with the American Red Cross and bring hope to patients in need can be made at RedCrossBlood.org or 1-800-RED CROSS.

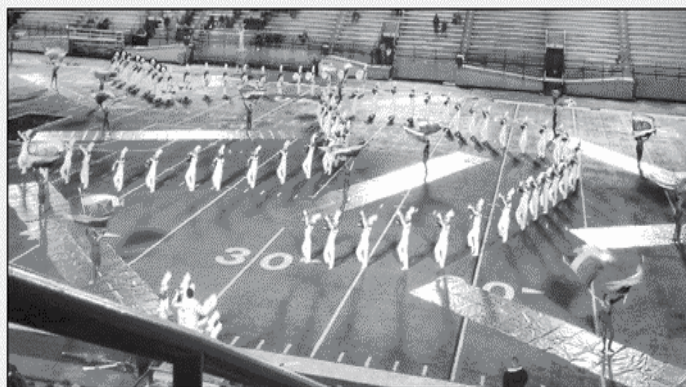
