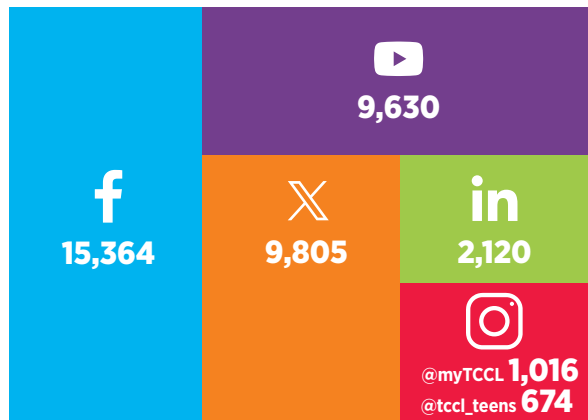

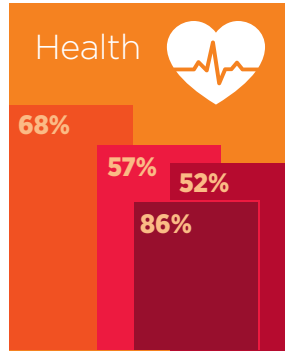
computer usage

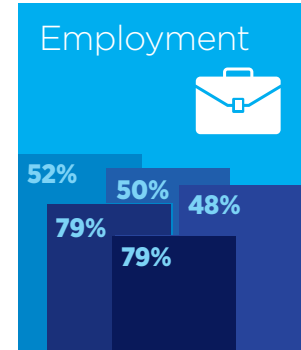

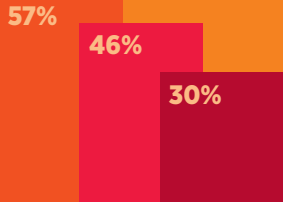

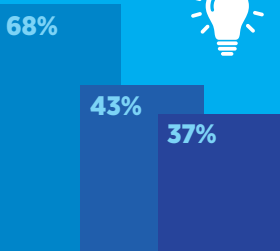
E-Commerce
